Academy of Notre Dame Dress Code Requirements

The school attire for the Academy of Notre Dame includes: a gray plaid skirt, no shorter than 2 inches above the knee. Skirts are not to be rolled up or hemmed above school requirement. Tan "chino" style long pants, not tight-fitting. Chino style Capri pants may be worn from May 1st to October 15th. White monogrammed blouses (long or short sleeved) can be worn, as well as white, navy blue, burgundy, or pink monogrammed long or short-sleeved polo shirt. Also allowed are white turtlenecks and mock turtlenecks. Crew, cardigans, and v-neck sweaters with monogram in either navy blue or burgundy, or sweatshirts in gray or navy blue with monogram may be worn. Navy blue, wine, or grey tights or knee socks are permitted, but tights and socks should be plain or cabled and may not be textured or patterned. Flat-soled, low cut dress shoes, clogs, and sneakers may be worn. Also allowed are sandals with a back strap, but only from May 1st to October 15th. Not permitted are boots or boot-type footwear, high heels, platform shoes, slipper-like shoes, flip-flops, and Adidas sandals. Students are expected to be in uniform throughout the entire school day, and uniforms should be clean and neat with no rips, tears, or stains of any kind.

Students are not permitted to display unnatural hair coloring, visible tattoos, and visible body piercing with the exception of ear piercing not to exceed two simple earrings on each ear lobe.
